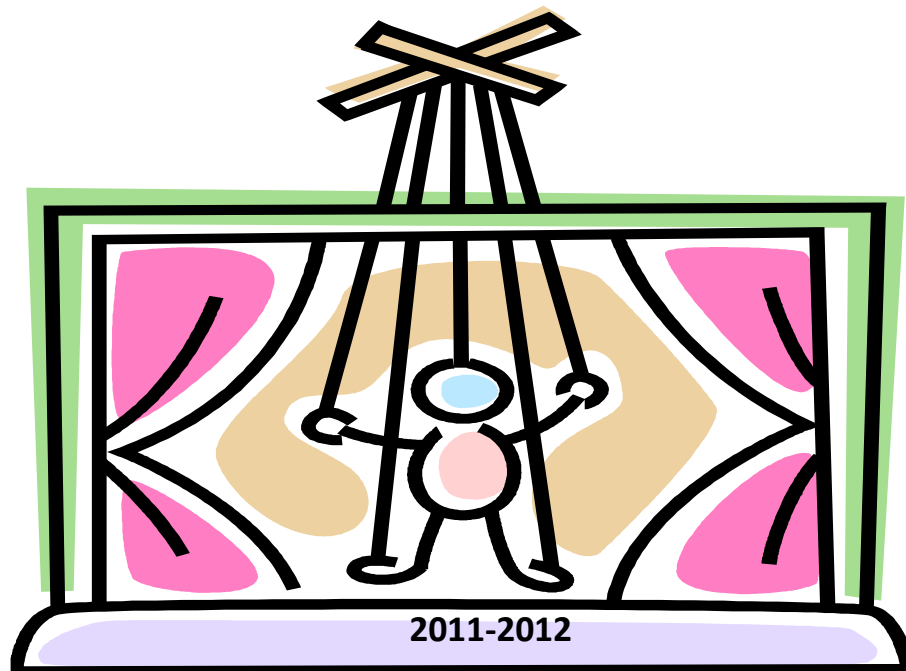

All performances are on Sundays at 2:00 PM and are held in the school auditoriums. The Series consist of four shows during the school year that provide cultural entertainment and enjoyment to children and their families. The shows are appropriate for children in grades K-5, and range from musicals to puppetry.

★ During the year Children's Entertainment and Cultural Arts representatives of the UPTC Entertainment Committee help with the selection of shows to be featured in the Entertainment Series. Parent volunteer representatives are always welcome to participate and help with the committee selections. Contact the UPTC President for information on volunteering.

★ Subscription prices for the four shows are \$15 per child, and \$24 per adult. Individual tickets are available for purchase day of show. The ticket counter is open one hour prior to each performance; cost is \$5 per child, and \$8 per adult. Arrangement can be made to accommodate children's birthday parties before or after the performance. Party facility fee \$50.00.

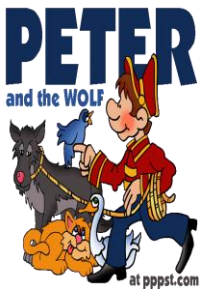
## “The Hey-Ya Brothers Variety Show”
