


The SAT Suite of Assessments

The SAT® Suite of Assessments is an integrated system of tests that helps establish a baseline of college and career readiness, tracks student progress, and identifies areas for improvement.



The Transition to Digital Testing



Digital SAT Suite: What's staying the same?



The digital SAT Suite will continue to measure the knowledge and skills that matter most for college and career readiness



The digital SAT Suite will keep the same scoring scale



The digital SAT Suite will still be administered in a school or in a test center with a proctor present (not at home)



Students will still have free, world-class practice resources



Students will continue to connect directly to scholarships and College Board National Recognition Programs



All students will be supported, including those who receive accommodations on test day

Digital SAT Suite: What's changing?



Taken on a laptop, tablet, iPad, or school-managed Chromebook or desktop computer



About 2 hours instead of 3, with more time per question




Shorter reading passages



A built-in calculator is allowed on the entire math section








Structured similarly to the SAT, the PSAT/NMSQT (Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) is given to 10th-or 11th-grade students and measures the same knowledge and skills students need to succeed in college and career.

The test is designed to help prepare students for the SAT, college, and careers. Historically, students who took the PSAT/NMSQT scored higher on the SAT, on average, than those who didn't take the test.

Get More from Their Score

While the PSAT/NMSQT is great practice for the SAT, there's so much more to be gained from their score.

See Where They Are and Set a Target

- Your child will receive insights about their knowledge and skills while they still have plenty of time to improve.
- If Taking the PSAT/NMSQT will help your child set an SAT target score that aligns with their college or career goals.



National Merit Scholarship Program

- Students who take the PSAT/NMSQT in 11th grade and meet other program entry requirements might qualify for the National Merit[®] Scholarship Program, an academic competition for recognition and scholarships conducted by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC[®]).
- The PSAT/NMSQT is the only qualifying test for the National Merit Scholarship Program.




Help Pay for College

- Students may also qualify for College Board National Recognition Programs.




Find Out About Their AP Potential

- Using their personalized score report, students will get recommendations about what AP courses might be a good fit for them.



Explore College and Career Options in BigFuture School


- BigFuture School[™] is a new mobile app for students (13+) who take certain College Board assessments in school.
- It's designed to spark their interest about planning for their future the moment scores are available.
- Students can use the app to access their PSAT/NMSQT scores directly on their phone, along with:
 - Customized career information and guidance about planning and paying for college.
 - -Connections[™]—a feature exclusively for school day test takers that allows them to hear from nonprofit colleges and scholarship programs that may be a good match, without sharing any personal information.
- Students should start on the app and then go to BigFuture.org for deeper exploration.



Accessing Score Reports

There are several ways your child can access their scores.


- BigFuture School Mobile App: If your child chooses to provide a
 mobile number during the testing experience, they'll receive a text
 message with information about accessing BigFuture School along
 with their scores. Their mobile number won't be used for any other
 purpose.
- Personal College Board Account: If they have a personal College Board account, your child can go to <u>studentscores.collegeboard.org</u> for more insights about their scores and next steps.


